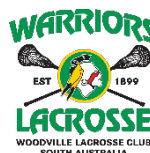

EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S REPORT

ACHIEVEMENTS

The 2025 season has been characterised by continued success across our programs, with State Teams once again delivering strong performances and representing South Australia with distinction. These achievements reflect the sustained commitment and professionalism of our athletes, coaches, and support staff.

A significant milestone was the participation of South Australian players in the inaugural Sixes Lacrosse competition, across both senior and junior divisions. This innovative, fast-paced format introduced new energy to the sport, and our players demonstrated adaptability, enthusiasm, and skill in embracing the challenge.

DEVELOPMENTS

Another key advancement was the introduction and trial of live scoring. This initiative enhanced the immediacy and visibility of match data for players, coaches, and spectators. It must be noted, however, that live scoring cannot be utilised when players remain unregistered. This limitation restricts access to the system, compromises the accuracy of game records, and undermines overall competition integrity.

CHALLENGES

The prevalence of unregistered players continues to present challenges across several clubs. This issue should not be deferred until finals, as it directly impacts the reliability of game data, the validity of award voting, and the availability of live scoring. Timely and accurate player registration is therefore essential to ensure fair recognition of contributions and the smooth operation of competition systems.

RECOMMENDATIONS

To strengthen these processes, the introduction of structured scorekeeper training sessions is recommended. Training will encompass:

- Understanding the critical importance of player registration
- Accurate data entry for match results and award voting
- Correct application of the live scoring platform
- Troubleshooting common in-game issues

Accurate and reliable game data remains fundamental to supporting fair play, enabling performance analysis, and informing strategic planning. Continued investment in data collection and reporting systems will deliver benefits across all levels of the sport.

ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS

Acknowledgement is extended to club committees and volunteers, whose sustained efforts underpin the success of lacrosse in South Australia. Their commitment to both the sport and their communities is deeply valued.

OUTLOOK

Looking forward, the focus remains on strengthening operational systems, supporting player development, and fostering the growth of lacrosse throughout South Australia.

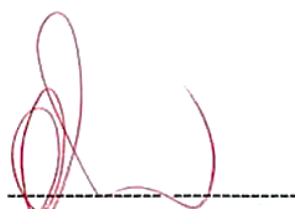

DIRECTOR REPORT - CHAIR

On behalf of the Lacrosse South Australia (LSA) Board, I am pleased to present the 2025 Annual Report. This past year has brought both progress and challenges. With a small number of directors and a significant list of strategic and operational priorities, it has been difficult to complete all the work required. Governance expectations continue to grow, and dividing responsibilities across a limited board has been demanding. While we have made some meaningful strides, we openly acknowledge that there are areas where we must do better and increase our focus in 2026.

In 2025 we strengthened our board with the appointment of Charlotte Whinnen. This addition prompted the executive team and me to explore adjustments to our board structure to help reduce the workload placed on current members and create a more appealing environment for future directors.

Despite capacity constraints, the board worked diligently with the LSA office to meet organisational goals, uphold governance requirements, and remain responsive as we could be to our community.

The LSA office, led by **Giulia Marion**, has continued to serve the needs of our sport with dedication. We thank **Jarrod Brimble** for his work over the past year as Sport Development and Events Coordinator, and his role at LSA and wish him well on his travels.

We warmly welcome **Reece Townsley**, whose enthusiasm and lacrosse expertise are already proving valuable. **Rachael Boys**, now one year into her role as Sports Administration and Finance Assistant, has strengthened our administrative processes, club support, and social media presence.

Without a board secretary in 2025, essential governance tasks were shared across the board and office team. While we met core requirements, we acknowledge that significant work remains to bring our governance practices to the standard expected, such as complaints handling.

Nathan, Mark, and Charlotte have each provided fresh perspective and helped champion lacrosse growth, and we recognise the importance of continuing to develop depth across field and box lacrosse while Lacrosse Australia pursues sixes and Olympic pathways, with more work to be done in this space.

In 2026, we will re-establish clear portfolios, reactivate subcommittees and forums, and ensure broader member involvement to support growth and development across South Australian Lacrosse.

Reflecting on my time as Director and Acting Chair, I have been grateful to work with a small but committed team striving to balance the needs of our community, players, and staff. My focus this year was on reconnecting with our members, promoting professional development, and commencing structured review processes. While we held one all-clubs meeting, we acknowledge that this falls short of what is needed and expectations.

In 2026 we will implement a **consistent schedule of member forums** and publish board meeting dates to ensure full transparency.

A key learning from this year has been the implementation of the new demerit rules process. While the intent was intended to be positive change, the execution created frustration and highlighted the need for deeper member involvement. We have heard this feedback clearly and this is currently being collated for a post implementation review in 2026 at our first club meeting. The aim will be to review the feedback received and establish a revised, post-season pathway for rule review and implementation.

I also acknowledge that Giulia often stepped beyond her formal role to help meet critical compliance requirements, especially in the absence of a secretary and with limited board capacity. Her commitment has been invaluable. As she prepares for extended leave in 2026, we will work with members to plan for continuity and support.

Alongside day-to-day responsibilities, the LSA team and I have continued working on aligning our policies with contemporary standards. This includes 45 core policies and numerous sub-policies. This year we prioritised Board Diversity, Board Charter updates, Strategic Planning, and EO performance criteria based on audit recommendations. Strengthening director roles and board structure will be a major focus in 2026.

Unfortunately, we have also seen a record number of incidents recorded this year. The board is committed to fostering a positive, respectful environment where all employees, volunteers, and members feel safe and supported.

We also know that our complaints-handling processes needs to be clearer and more consistent and follow the procedural fairness all complaints require, in a timely manner.

We will provide all clubs and members with the new Sport Integrity Australia complaints handling framework for review and adoption in the coming months.

Working closely with **Pete Unwin**, General Manager of Australian Lacrosse we thank Pete for his contribution and support prior to his departure.

With expanded formats such as Sixes, iLAX, Summer Lax, and Box Lacrosse, our sport now operates year-round, creating exciting opportunities but also increasing pressure on clubs, volunteers, and officials.

In 2026 we will work with local and state government to pursue support and funding opportunities that reflect these growing demands and further funding opportunities to support this. It is a great problem to have being busy all year round however with this come volunteer burnout, and we are seeing smaller number of them and more work, which can't be sustainable no matter how good we are.

DIRECTOR REPORT

This year has been my third time on the LSA Board and much has changed since my previous election, which was interrupted then by my 6-years on the Board of Lacrosse Australia as Director Officiating.

There are many less LSA Board members now which is partly the design of the current constitution but also due to a lack of volunteers who are able to free themselves from their Club, Family and/or Work commitments to help focus on the management and future development of Lacrosse in SA.

Since my appointment I have been involved in identifying and securing the services of an independent Commissioner, Steven Mathwin, to review behavioural issues and disputes by members of LSA and their clubs that cannot be resolved by on field officials. Steve is an ex-player for Adelaide University and a retired South Australian Magistrate.

This season, after considerable discussion and modification, the LSA Board voted to apply a trial of the Penalty Demerit System. Adjustments were made from the original as used by Lacrosse Australia to make it more suitable for multi-division seasonal competitions. The purpose of the system is to facilitate and simplify the application of player/participant suspensions from competitions for unsporting, unsafe or excessively violent play. The system was successful in monitoring and penalizing repeat and serious offenders on the lacrosse field in a timely manner, though not surprisingly it was not popular with those it affected. A post field season review will be held to improve the Penalty Demerit System for the 2026 season and beyond.

The selection of Under 15 Boys team coaches was an interesting process that I believe was successful but could be improved. There was contention regarding the coach selections which, though valid to the individuals concerned, were not detrimental to the performances of the teams. The coaches did a great job of coordinating and managing their teams, and I believe the players all enjoyed their experiences.

Prior to the start of the Junior Boys season, I reviewed and updated the Under 15 and Under 13 Boys Modified Rules. As requested, I aligned the Under 15 Boys rules with those used by Lacrosse Australia in their National Tournament. I tidied up the Under 13 Boys modified rules to remove unnecessary wording and to clarify what had already been established.

Recently a meeting was held with interested parties from a number of different clubs and teams to review and discuss Under 13 Boys Modified Rules. The overwhelming opinion of those who attended was that the current U13 Boys Modified Rules are not fit for purpose, that is they do not assist in the development of the players lacrosse skills, and that the full-sized field is too large for those teams consisting of very young players which regularly only compete with 8 on-field players. The opinions and recommendations from that meeting and the resultant participant email conversations, have been presented to the Board for comment and direction. From there the Clubs will be consulted on the best way to move forward for this competition.

I look forward to Season 2026 and hope to see more people volunteer to apply for a director position on the Board. We need more people who are willing to assist in the management of the sport in it's various disciplines and help guide it toward an ongoing successful future in SA.

SPORT DEVELOPMENT & EVENT REPORT

In 2025 we again ran three successful club carnivals, taking place at Brighton, Glenelg and Burnside, as well as the ever well attended SACPSSA carnival at Glenelg and Woodville.

NAPLAN continues to be a thorn in our side when it comes to the fixturing of these carnivals, with all three of our club events taking place within the span of ten days. Thankfully, Easter was a few weeks removed from NAPLAN this year, making it less of a squeeze on volunteers who are also involved in U18s. Looking ahead to 2026, it seems there will be a similar gap.

The South Australian Catholic Primary Schools Sports Association Lacrosse Carnival attracted similar numbers to last year, with 195 teams taking part (compared to 197 last year) and approximately 1,500 children in attendance. Thank you again to all the volunteers who assisted in making this carnival possible, and a special thanks to our hosts, the Glenelg and Woodville Lacrosse Clubs, who as always did a fantastic job.

In March I advised LSA of my intention to depart towards the end of this year as my university studies were concluding and I wished to do some long-term travelling overseas. Since then, Reece Townsley has been hired to take over my role and, as of writing this report, I have spent the past few weeks working with Reece to ensure a smooth transition. Reece brings with him a wealth of lacrosse experience and enthusiasm for the development of the sport. I wish him all the very best and am sure he will do a terrific job.

Thank you to the entire South Australian lacrosse community who welcomed an outsider to the sport with open arms. I think at some point or another every single club has offered me a place in their MD2 team, sorry that I let you all down on that front! I'd like to extend my thanks to Rachael Boys, Trish Adams and Marilyn Fuss, all of whom I had the pleasure of working with at various points during my time here. I'd also like to offer an especially big thank you to Giulia Marion, with whom I have worked for the entirety of my nearly eight years at LSA. She has contributed immensely to my development as a professional throughout that time.

SPORT ADMINISTRATION & FINANCE REPORT

The Junior Clinic in February, run by our State and Australian representatives, was a fantastic success and served as a great fundraiser for our senior state team players. The kids absolutely loved it, and the feedback was overwhelmingly positive.

Much of my focus throughout the year was on state team administration, which continues to be a major component of my role. Between both Giulia and myself, an incredible amount of time goes into managing all the logistics, communication, and coordination that comes with state programs. While we again faced some challenges ensuring uniforms and apparel arrived on time, no matter how early we place the orders, we always manage to receive what we need in the end.

Scoresheets continue to present their usual challenges when it comes to collection and follow-up, but overall, this area showed improvement compared to last year. One major challenge is the lack of unregistered players. A big thank you to Sue Hogan for her ongoing help collating the yellow scoresheets — it's very much appreciated. We introduced live scoring for a few games to test run in WSL and all ran smoothly (providing players were registered). Hopefully, we can expand on the live scoring initiative next year, though funding for iPads, chargers, and related equipment remains a key consideration.

A huge thank you to everyone who assisted in any capacity throughout the year — your contributions are always valued and appreciated. While the LSA Board remains small in numbers, you all did such a great job this year — thank you for your continued support.

Welcome to Reece Townsley, who has already been a fantastic addition to the LSA staff.

Finally, a special thank you to Jarrod Brimble for his dedication and efforts at Lacrosse SA over the past 7.5 years. I wish him all the very best in his next adventure.
